COMHALTAS - CORONAVIRUS Communication No. 15

In compliance with Government guidelines and restrictions in relation to the coronavirus pandemic, Comhaltas announced at an early stage that Fleadh Cheoil na hÉireann, scheduled for Mullingar next August, was cancelled. The Fleadh is one of the biggest cultural events in the world. It attracted 750,000 people from all over the world last year and generated over €50 million for the region.

In addition to the Fleadh, Comhaltas also cancelled a major part of our cultural programme including:

- County and Provincial Fleadhanna;
- 40 community festivals;
- Annual Congress;
- SCT examinations for the present;
- Classes for the present- except online;
- Summer SEISIÚN programme;
- Closure of 18 cultural centres.

This is a severe blow for the cultural and economic life of many communities. However, Comhaltas is already planning a programme of renewal and enhancement for all our activities and events at home and abroad. Fleadh 2021 is again scheduled for Mullingar – 'bigger and better'. Ar aghaidh leis an gceol!

- The Buanchoiste has received many suggestions for ways to keep the wheels turning in the uncertain times ahead. There are many examples at home and abroad of Comhaltas initiatives and creativity in these difficult times. Peter Denmead has suggested that, when we emerge from the crisis, CEOL AN GHEIMHRIDH is a ready-made and entertaining event to provide a platform for young performers, particularly during the winter months. This is operated successfully at present by Comhairle na Mumhan. Perhaps other provinces would like to join. We are sure that the ever-efficient Rúnaí na Mumhan, Assunta, would advise where required. - Is there an opportunity these days to add to our 'cúpla focal' of spoken Irish? Could we add a new word, phrase or sentence each day or even a seanfhocal? Comhaltas in America is one of the brightest jewels in the crown.
- The determined and efficient duo Patrick Morrison and Siobhán Ní Chonoráin are burning the mid-night oil to help keep the diaspora flame burning brightly. Our people and the friends of Ireland throughout the world who are facing severe challenges deserve all our support. They are an important cog in the cultural wheel and central to the story of Ireland. The Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade are very supportive of our work and it is hoped that a mechanism can be devised to fill any gaps which require attention.
